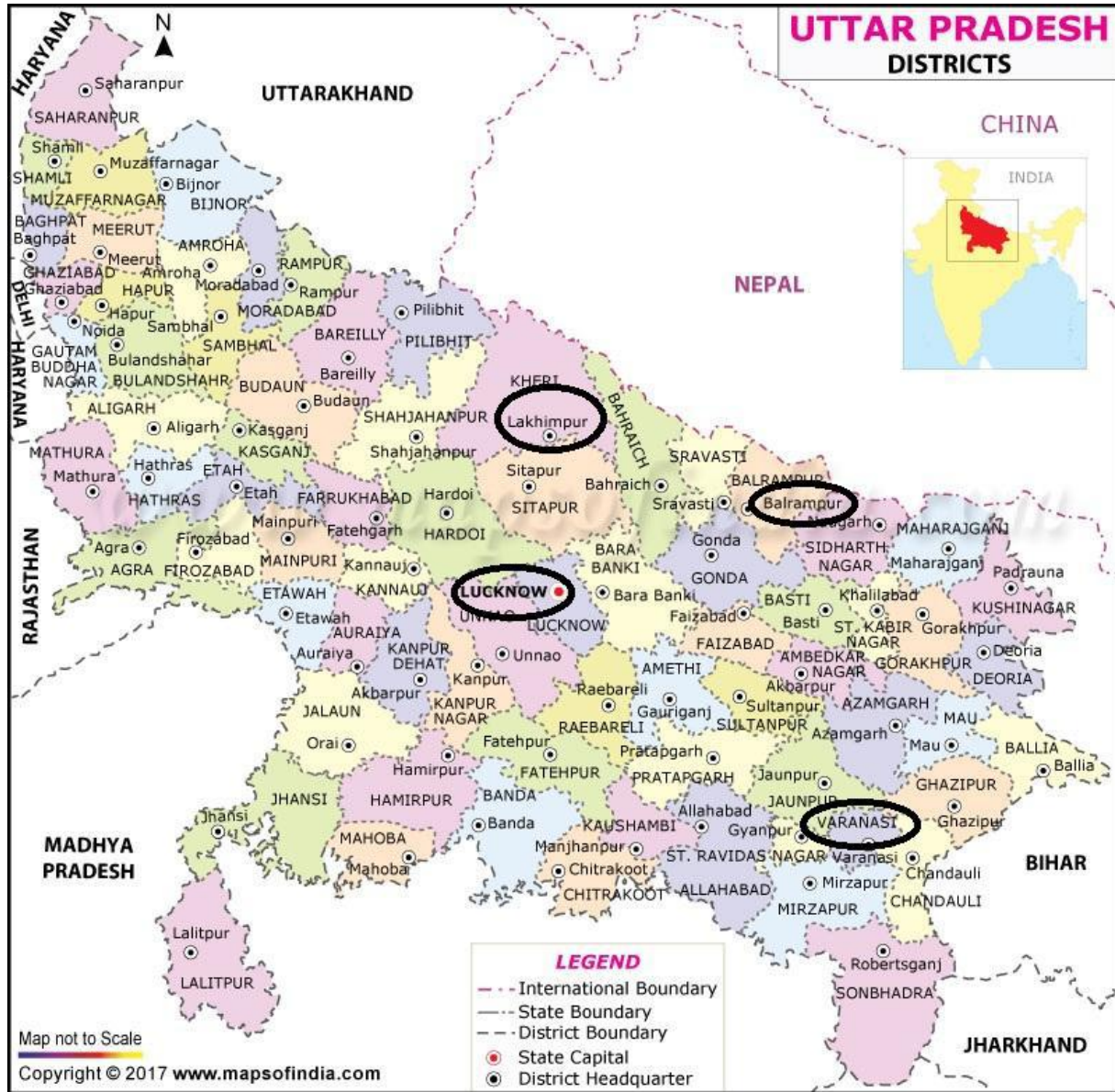

Aim works with Children



Aim Trust is working with children of marginalized community for ensuring their rights. Aim focus is that every child should get the Right to Education. Children must know what is going in their society, what is their role in the society. Aim works to improve the quality of education as per Right to Education norms.

Aim works towards improving the status of children and to create safe, secure and reliable environment for every child to grow develop and survive with dignity and without any discrimination and prejudice.

Aim believes in strengthening child rights because children should be able to enjoy their childhood in a free atmosphere. They do not need sympathy but due share of their rights. Aim provides to all its children an enabling environment for quality services of education, health, clean water and sanitation so as to ensure their well being. Aim work towards improving the status of children to create safe, secure and reliable environment for every child to grow develop and survive with dignity and without any discrimination and prejudice. Aim acts with multidimensional approach to engage parents, teachers, government, local bodies and media to address children's issues.

The Aim Trust has been working on the issue of child education in Mitauli Block of Lakhimpur Kheri district with the support of CRY- Child Right and You, New Delhi. 12 Gram Panchayat had been selected as a intervention area in which there are 14 Primary School and 6 Upper Primary School in 15 villages in which the total number of family are 2630 (GEN -140, OBC/BC – 1175, Muslim -152 and SC – 1162). The total population is 13689 and Age wise Children

Strengthens community monitoring mechanisms for child rights by strengthening school management committees and Gram Panchayats in the intervention area.

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our endeavours to make gender equality a lived reality. We organise and manage Children's forum (Bal Manch) to mobilize children to ensure participation, provides an opportunity to share their views, feelings and concern regarding education and health.

Base Line survey

Baseline survey work done in 15 villages (Khamhariya, Kachiyani, Rewana, Pakariya, Musadei, Nimchaini, Kaima, Bhagwant Nagar, Dari, Samarsepur, Osari, Bhithara, Gahira, Rampurwa and Chandpurwa) in which the total number of family are 2630 (GEN -140, OBC/BC – 1328 and SC –



1162). The total population is 13689 and Age wise Children were surveyed. The Survey started with door to door visit of family, We asked the questionnaire step by step and filled the format. After filling the entire format in hard copy, the format sent to Lucknow office where all the data entries done in excel format. After finishing the data entry work, a draft study of baseline survey sent to Nikhil ji and Vineet ji. The finalization of Baseline data is in progress.

Constitution of Kishore Manch

Kishori Manch Constituted in 15 intervention village to promote adolescent girls in village for education and to improve their living standard and to resolve their problems in every aspect including their willingness to know about their biological changes and security etc. At the starting of the process, we consult each kishori on door to door basis and tried to convince her and her parents for participate in our meeting. After that we organized some village level meeting with adolescent group and discussed their education related issue. In some course of time we facilitated adolescent to make a group where we can discuss



our health and education related issues. After sometime they got ready to do the same. We constituted 15 groups of adolescent where we conducted monthly wise meeting in these village for adolescent girls, we started with the Meena concept at every village our volunteer talked to the adolescent girls and taught them that the adolescent

is the period of intense and rapid development , characterized by numerous development task of gaining a new and mature relationship, adapting a feminine social roles , emotional independence from parents and other adults and onset of sexual maturity. Our volunteer taught them about all these changes in the body and to how to use safe and clean clothes or sanitary napkin at such period of time with the concept of saheli paheli. we tried to describe the adolescent girl about all these changes . A Successful meeting conducted in all intervening village with the adolescent girls in first phase

School Bhejo Abhiyan

Community meeting as a “School Bhejo Abhiyan” organized in 15 villages in which 134 Female and 112 Male participated. We discussed about the role of parent for sending the school. We also discussed and detailed the



RTE act , role of SMC and how we will make a good environment for children in school and community for their better development.

During the discussion, people shared their problems or social problem for not sending their ward especially girls like.

- Junior School are far from the village
- Fear of untoward incident with his children
- financial problems
- Transportation We tried to convince him for sending their child .after that they agreed for the same.

Meeting with Adolescent Girl on Village Health and Nutrition Day and life skill

Meeting was organized in Village Kaima with adolescent girl, ANM (Auxiliary Nurse and Midwife) and AWW (Anganwadi Worker) on 21 October 2018 on the issue of their health, hygiene, education and Malnutrition. There was 20 Adolescent, 6 Boys and 7 Girls and 8 pregnant women presented in the meeting, we discussed about their health issue like menstrual cycle, eating habits and nutrition. We are also described the importance of VHND and its work.



We also discussed about the life skill and did some activity of life skill like telling about own life, strength and weakness and dream. We tried to do confidence building of adolescent girl on their problem, expectation from community and their speaking power

Meeting of Bal Manch

Village level children meet was organized for involving children and members of community in villages of intervention area. The core objective of the activity was to promote the right to participation of children across the Project area and give a platform to share their problems, experience and learning. Children participated in activities like games, story, table, counting and joke telling. The discussion on school retention and enrolment was also done during the activity.

Bal manch was constituted in 15 villages to promote child centric and children based organization as to ensure and promote child right issue at school and village. It's platform for



raising the voice of children and to secure their individuality for the protection and rights of children in village. As monthly meeting was conducted by Bal Manch in all intervening villages to prompt the child right as there are no. of issue for out of school children or drop out we are working with the children improve their quality of education as our learning centers in village provide remedial teaching to these children. It took almost one month to convince community as to let them understand the importance of education in their life and for their children future some of them get

convinced but still long way to go to achieve our goal.

Bal Mela

Children's Day celebrated in 5 Schools of our intervention area in which 5 Headmaster, 8 Assistant teachers, 3 Para Teacher, 11 SMC members were participated. The celebration started with the story of Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru and his work to nation. After that aim team shared about the four rights of children –

Right to Survive

Right to Security

Right to Development

Right to Participation



All teachers shared their information and view on Children's Day and children of school were also sung some song and poems. After that all children opened their small shops and display their dishes and other materials to participants. They also gave us opportunity to purchase his/her product on their fixed rate.

Fun learning with children

A fun learning activity was conducted in all intervening villages for fun learning and identification of different letter and numbers through games for the children improve their quality of education as our learning centers in village provide remedial teaching to these children.



Celebration of World Environment Day

An event was organized on date 05 June 2018 in 10 Villages of intervention area (Bhagwant Nagar, Musadei, Nimchiani, Kaima, Osari, Rewana, Pakariya, Dari, Gahira and Bhithara) on occasion of World Environment Day where 215 Girl and 252 Boys and 80

member presented during the event. In the Event, We organized hand painting activity, Drawing on environment and rally to village for giving the message to keep the surroundings clean and save the our planet Earth. We also raised some slogans like- "Ped Podhe lagao, Paryavaran ko bachao" We

discussed the importance of nature and environment in our life as on the occasion we performed following activity. Plantation in the field and garden.

Celebration of Yoga Day

Yoga Day organized on 21 June 2018 in all 15 villages in which 217 girls, 186 boys and 25 Community member participated. We discussed the importance of yoga for making healthy our body. We also discussed some simple yoga practiced. We discussed the following yoga practice with the children-

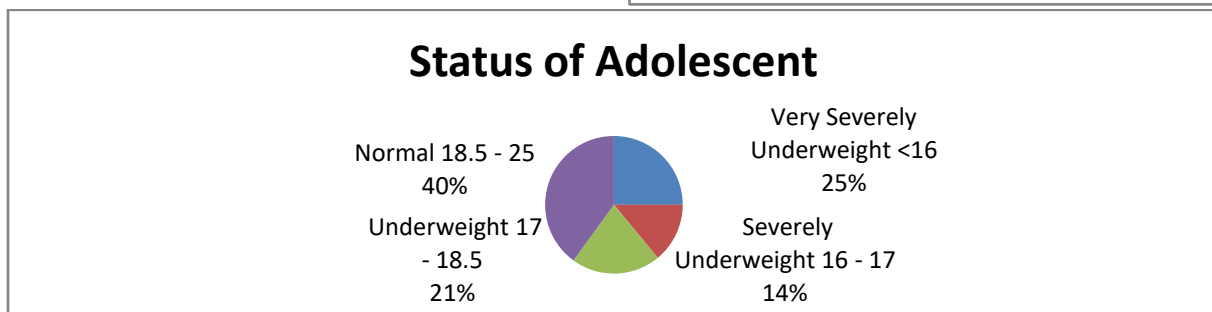
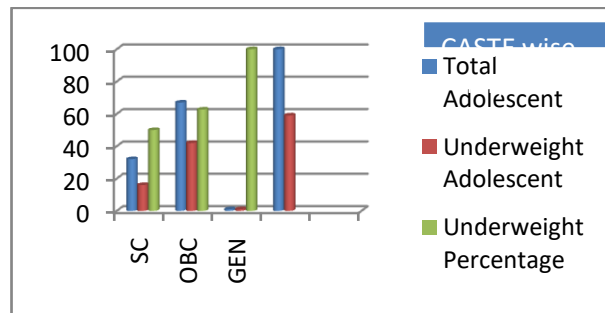
- Mountain Pose (Tadasana)

Meeting and analysis of BMI of Adolescent Girls

A meeting was organized in 6 villages(Dari, Bhagwant Nagar, Osari, Rampurwa, Musadei and Bhithara) with adolescent girl on the issue of their health, hygiene, education and Malnutrition . There was 100 Adolescent, 30 Boys and 25 Girls and 20 Community people present In the meeting, we discussed about few things which we should be eating in our daily routine and

also discussed about their rights and violence related issues. After deeply discussion in the meeting, **We measured the height, weight and age of the 100 adolescent girls**



CBO's meeting

Rozi Roti Sangathan CBO made in all intervening villages for the proper monitoring of school in the village. The monthly meeting was held with these CBOs to ensure their active participation in village education and to empower them to demand anything which is good for the proper and good education for their children in the elementary school. Monthly meeting was conducted in all intervening villages as to empower community based organization as a result of which 20 number of application regarding different issue was sent to the proper authority based on infrastructure, toilet and facility of drinking water in school



Children Baseline of CAC and Learning Corner

As per it was decided in the education training during 18 - 20 September 2018 in Lucknow, We have done Child baseline of 550 children in 15 villages of Block Mitauli, District Lakhimpur Kheri to know about the child learning status in hindi and maths. During this process, we organized some activities like poem and storytelling with action and games. We called children one by one and gave him/her the questionnaire of baseline that is based on Hindi and Maths subject. The volunteers observed all the activity and children status and wrote back of the question paper after going the each children.



School Activation Parameter

School activation parameter filled in 15 villages (Musadei, Dari, Samarsepur, Rampurwa, Bhithara, Bhagwant Nagar, Nimchaini, Chandpurwa, Gahira, Pakariya, Rewana, Osari, Kachiyani, Khamhariya and Kaima). After filling the data of 15villages. the following observation came out -

- ✓ Teachers not come and leave the school on time
- ✓ MDM not made as per menu
- ✓ Teachers not teaches students as per routine
- ✓ Toilet not in proper condition
- ✓ Teacher uses the children toilet and always locked the toilet
- ✓ Library established on paper, not in practice

On the basis of school activation parameter, we organized some meeting and shared the gaps in the school and wrote the letter to BSA and BEO to solve the problems.

Enrollment of drop out children in school

We Facilitated and counseled the Parents, children and teachers for enrollment of children. Child Profiling of 358 Girls and 354 Boys have been done in 15 villages of Block Mitauli, District Lakhimpur Kheri to know about the child status and their families. During this process, the volunteers ask the question regarding their family details of child, contact details, reason of dropout, migration status in families and their present status of children etc. The volunteers fill the data in the form. During the profile filling , We took a simple test of children as per their class and age. after that we made 3 group of children as per their learning and knowledge about the subject.



Capacity building of CAC Coordinator and Village Volunteer

A meeting organized with village volunteer and CAC coordinator on 26 July 2018 at Ratahra, kasta, Lakhimpur Kheri. The main goal of the meeting was making an understanding on innovation in centre's like decoration and different activities. In the meeting, the discussion was held on monthly update of children, innovation and activities. We also described the process step by step for filling of children profile.



Orientation meeting with staff

Two days orientation meeting was held in Lucknow from 12-13 February 2019. Meeting started with introduction of all staff with their role and responsibility then Mr. Ranjeet Kumar described the importance of MIS (Management Information System). He said now a day's every company/organization has to be up to date for his reputation and work. It can't be possible without a proper system of information.

KRA1- Educationally Empowering children through CAC/ Learning corners, who are dropped out, or are never been or , are in need of academic support by providing age appropriate competencies via pedagogical intervention, sports in education, life skills and remedial education



Community meeting

Monthly meeting was conducted in all intervening villages in which 113 Women and 57 Men are participated. The meeting was done to empower community based organization as a result of which 05 no of application regarding different issue was sent to the proper authority based on infrastructure, toilet and facility of drinking water in school. During the meeting, we also discussed about different provisions of Free and Compulsory RTE Act 2009 and SMC and their role and responsibility. We discussed about their role and responsibility in SMC and their children's education, after discussion they are ready to work in group and will raise their children's issue at village level and block level.



An initiative for change by cricket

Last year, an adolescent girls group was formed by us, which meeting was being held every month. In the meeting, the point came out that all the girls do not play any game in the villages, and many girls responded that 5-6 years ago she had played the game and many of the girls did not even remember when she was played in the villages. At the beginning, the adolescent girl were reluctant to play and was ashamed to play but as the game progressed, they began to feel good and she herself started playing and came forward. Right now we have played only to raise their interest in cricket, in which the girls were only batting and fielding, they have not yet been played with the rule but in some days they will be tried to play by the rules.



Interface with Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA)

Interface with MLA" has been organized on 05th March 2019 at Ratahra, Kasta, Lakhimpur Kheri by Aim with the support of CRY, New Delhi. 45 Girls and 32 Boys were presented in the workshop. Workshop started with the poem and songs with the children. After that Mr. Ranjeet Kumar welcomes of the participants and briefly described the purpose of the workshop. Ms. Suman, CAC Coordinator described her way of teaching and said there are 35 children in my CAC. We regular teach him/her with the help of TLM and I always start my class by poem and story with action.



Discussion with Adolescent for knowing status of RMSA

A meeting was organized in all village of our project to know the status of RMSA also the problem faced by adolescent.

During the discussion, Adolescent girls shared their view and problems to us. They said that there were no govt. school near to her village so that they had to go far from village for higher



study. Due to far of school, so many children got drop out from school after passing 8th standard

Capacity building of CAC Coordinator and Village Volunteer

A meeting organized with village volunteer and CAC coordinator on 18 December 2019 at Ratahra, kasta, Lakhimpur Kheri. The main goal of the meeting was making an understanding on innovation in centres like decoration and different activities. In the meeting, the discussion was held on monthly update of children, innovation and activities. A surprise test has been given to village volunteers and CAC coordinator. The question were based on below topics.



- Some formula of maths
- States and Capitals
- English words and their meaning

Workshop on RTE for SMC members

Objectives

- To aware SMC members about RTE
- To Describe role and responsibility and Power of SMC
- To be alert for constitute of SMC in July 2018
- Facilitate to make SDP (School Development Plan)
- To enroll more children in school in the month of July

“Workshop on RTE for SMC members” was conducted from 09th June to 10th June 2018 at Ratahra, Kasta Lakhimpur Kheri by Aim with the support of CRY, New Delhi . 15 Female and

25 Male were presented in the workshop. Workshop started with the welcomes of the participants after that we gave introduction of each others. Mr. Ranjeet Kumar briefly described the purpose of the workshop.

Training was conducted on the issue of RIGHT TO FREE AND COMPULSARY EDUCATION ACT 2009 . Training was given by Ranjeet Kumar on different issue and aspect of right to education and child right. The main Issue of the training is as follows:

- 1) Right of children for free and compulsory education
- 2) Constitution of SMC
- 3) Functioning of SMC
- 4) Right and duties of SMC
- 5) Formation and execution of school development plan



Independence Day Campaign

- An Independence Day Campaign organized in 4 Villages of Mitauli block in which 34 Girls and 27 Boys and community member participated. In the campaign, we discussed the role of our freedom fighters, leaders and community in our freedom. after that we talked on the goal of child and what will they want to be? The children groups shared their imagination with us. Some children wants to be a teacher.



Joyful learning in CAC and Learning corner using local materials

Objective -

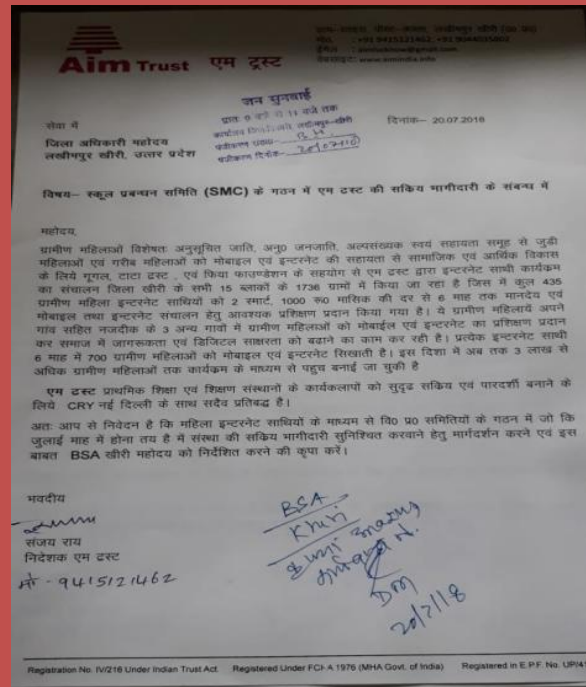

Case Study

Case Study 1

Name- Ankit Kumar

Village name- Bhithara, Panchayat – Bajarkha

Block name- Mitauli, District- Lakhimpur Kheri

My Name is Ankit Kumar. My father name is Dhani Ram and mother name is Pushpa Devi. I live in Bhithara village, Block Mitauli District Lakhimpur Kheri with my family. I have one brother (He is only one month old). My father is a farmer and he has only 2 bigha of land. He does vegetable farming in field. My mother is a house maker.

I had passed my primary school in 2016 but I didn't know any sentence of hindi and English. I was so afraid about maths also. My friends and neighbors were always tease and insult me, that's why I had decided for not got to school.



I was daily doing help my father in vegetable farming and shepherding the goat. It was my daily routine. My father was always insisted me on getting admission in school but I afraid to listen the name of school.

In 2018, Once in my village, a group of children was playing and a person was also playing with them. I went there, A person who were playing with the children came to me and introduced himself, He was Santram from Aim Trust. After that he asked my name and my education, I replied him that I never go to school. He offered me to play with group, I agreed with him and started playing.

After some days, Santram Ji came to my village and said that he has opened a learning corner in our village where children of government school will learn and enjoy. I got happy after listening that and thought that we will have fun there. On first day in learning corners, we played game and sung the song. In couple of days, they started to us identification of some Hindi letter and words. I really enjoyed there.

Gradually they taught me Hindi letters, sentence and alphabets. I came across all Hindi and English letter and sentence, I started feeling happy. One Day, Santram asked me for getting admission in school, firstly I got afraid but after counseling of him I got ready. One day Santram Ji came in my village and went to Bajarkha Upper Primary school along with me and my father. He talked to headmaster of upper primary school, After some time, Headmaster asked some question of Hindi and table of Maths, I answered him right. After that he wrote my name in his school register and enrolled in class 6. On that day I was very happy.

Now no one tease me and insult me, I daily go to my school with my friends and I am also a member of Bal Manch of village. It's all happened with the support of Aim Trust and Cry, New Delhi. I am very thankful for my support.



Case Study 2

Name- Khusboo Devi

Village name- Kachiyani, Panchayat - Rautapur

Block name- Mitauli, District- Lakhimpur Kheri



My name is Khusboo Devi . My father name is Shravan Kumar and mother name is Savitri Devi. I am 13 Year old, I live in Kachiyani village, Block Mitauli District Lakhimpur Kheri with my family. I have one sisters and two Brother (Shobhni Devi 6 Class, Deepak Kumar 10th pass and Atul Kumar class 9). My father is a mason and he has only 1 bigha of land

I dropped out of school in 2016 after passing 5th standard. I requested my father for enrollment in class 6 but he refused and said we have no enough money for your education, your brother and sister are studying so you don't need of education. So My parents not allowed me to go school. In the month of March 2018, a learning corner opened by Aim Trust with support of CRY in my village where all children of 6 to 14 years goes for study and fun learning. One day Aim Trust member came to my home requested my parent for sending me to learning corners. After that one day I went to the learning corner were approx 25 children presented, I learnt some games activities and Hindi subject.

After some days, Aim Trust member went to my home along with me and facilitated my father about girl education and requested & explained my parent for my enrollment in class 6. After few days, my father went to school along with me at Upper primary School and talked to Sri Sunil Kumar, Headmaster for my enrollment but he refused and said first gave me the affidavit of children for gapping of 1 year. My father came to home and next day told all incidents to Aim Trust member. After listening that He went to the upper primary school and talked to Sri Sunil Kumar and said him according to RTE you have to enroll the children as per their appropriate age and class without demanding any document like affidavit, proof of age etc. After that headmaster got little fear and said to him please bring the child I'll enroll her in school. After some time, Aim member came to me and took me to school where Sri Sunil Kumar write my name in his school register and enrolled me in class 6. Now I go to school regularly with my friends, Thank You Aim Trust and CRY.

Urban Poor



AIM works with Urban Poor

Inclusive City - 2 Project (Varanasi)

Census 2011, the population of Varanasi municipal area is 1,597,051. According to the State Urban Development Agency-Suda, there are 227 slum dwellers all over the city in Varanasi. A total of 557568 population lives in slums, which is approximately 36.29% of the total population

Non-implementation of the following eligibility and acquisition rights is still needed to focus more on the inclusive city-2 program. Minimum wages - Unorganized sector workers do not get proper wages; Even the agreed wages are not paid on time. Many women are also involved in handloom weaving, carpet weaving, domestic work, garbage collection and a variety of other handicrafts. These women are also discriminated against in the payment of proper wages.

Housing & Water issue

The condition of living for the urban poor is very bad. Government schemes are not focused on the shelter rights of the urban poor. They are compelled to live in slums, semi-constructed houses, sidewalks, various Ganga ghats and temples, on the road side of Varanasi without proper infrastructure. The surrounding environment is very unhygienic.

Social Security

These workers do not have any social security and benefits. They have no such provision for pension and insurance plans, maternity leave, accident and death claims, concession loans and financial assistance for children's education and medical needs.



Identity and Citizenship

Most urban poor and informal workers do not have Aadhaar card, ration card or Voter ID and thus there is no access to the government's welfare schemes.

Varanasi was one of the selected cities under the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission-JNURM for fast track improvement based urban development in December 2005. The mission has two sub-missions- Urban infrastructure and governance and basic services for the urban poor.



Major activities planned and implemented in the year (IGSS)

1. The survey of 1000 families from 1st April to 30th April, 10 slums of Varanasi, which is as

follows - Survey carried out in Suraiya Rahmatpura Maminpura small Masjid Bhatta area on the banks of Khirkiya Ghat, Kila Kohna, Nakchi Ghat, Kajakpura Koniya Tulsu Kuan river.

2. The meeting- 06 to 07 May 2018, was organized in the Lucknow AIM. Office to guide the workers for the inclusive city project work in which the project workers were told in detail about the objectives and implementation of the project.

3. 21 May 18 In the Prime Minister's Office, in the Prime Minister's Office, the people of the community held a meeting with Mr. Shivsharan Pathak, in-charge of the office, and kept the problem of drinking water. As a result, Shri Shivsharan Pathak Ji, in-charge of the office, appointed Municipal commissioner Varanasi for the availability of drinking water in the Saraiya mini tube well The letter issued in relation to the implication was issued.



4. A workshop was organized on 24th June 18 in which people were given information about the government-run welfare schemes like Prime Minister's housing scheme, old age-widow-handicapped pension scheme, Right to Education, Opening of Voter-base PAN card, Bank Account etc. Duly informed about how to get it.

Aim Worked

(July 2018 to September 2018)

Khirkiya Ghat had two taps in the population, in which one tap was completely defective and leaving one tap water, due to which the problem of drinking water was critical, it was decided that the repair of both the taps and the repair of the new tap Attempt to apply. In the Parliamentary Office, a demand letter was given for repair of damaged drains and a new tap, the office in-charge Mr. Shiv Sharan Pathak wrote a letter to the local MLA here and asked him to meet him On August 28, 18. A permanent legislator and Minister of State, Shri Nilkanth Tiwari got a letter on the problem of drinking water, they assured immediate action On August 31, 18th,. After that, the repair of the damaged canal was completec
v
d in the first and second week of September and the beginning of a new India marka hand pump started from 28-09-2018.



A program was organized on 20th to 25th September 18 for community awareness in all the slums of the work area, with the sound system and sharing of the work, to make people aware about their rights.



Two days workshop on capacity building and RTI

On 26th September 18, the capacity building of the urban poor was organized, in which people were trained in relation to the basic rights of the urban poor, RTI. On 27th September 18, a workshop of community workers was organized in which the people of the community were trained in government-related schemes, RTI, regarding applying for their demands.



Aim Worked

(Oct 2018 till Dec 2018)

A Shelter Home was opened in collaboration with Mrs. Mridula Jaiswal On October 11, 18, the mayor of Varanasi, regarding the opening of the Shelter Home locked in Alipur and ensuring proper availability of electricity.

A meeting was held with Kharakia Ghat community On October 12, 18, on the issue of housing with the Minister of State for Home Shri Nilkanth Tiwari. A letter was written to the District Magistrate for proper action by the Honorable Minister. On 15th October 18th, the people of the community met with the Varanasi District Magistrate, demanding accommodation for the meeting of the Minister of State with the Minister of State, Shri Nilkanth Tiwari. On 19th October 18, a workshop was organized on the problems of weavers community in Saraiya, which discussed the rights of weavers. In this meeting, Mr. Sanjay Rai, Dr. Muhammad Arif was present from the Aim Trust.

A meeting was held with the disadvantaged community and local media under the 18 November 18, (press negotiation) Inclusive City 2 project in which the community members kept their problems before the media people. On 19th November 18th, Rahmat Purna, Weavers Community Workshop was organized in which weavers were given a strategy to get registered and other people in the handloom and textile department.

(a) Capacity building work of the urban poor in Rajghat Varanasi was organized in which 20 members of the community were trained by Mr. Harish Kumar on the subject of their rights and laws.

18 December 18, a meeting of the community was held in the Prime Minister's Office, Varanasi for the demand for electricity and health camps.



Aim Worked

(From January 2019 till March 2019)

From 6th January to 21st January, a campaign was organized in all the slums, under the Ujjwala Gas Scheme and Ayushman Bharat Scheme, the benefit of the people of the community Beneficiaries of Ayushman card beneficiary 18 / Ujjwala Gas 40.

12 February 2019 - In order to make the city of Varanasi a smart city, public dialogue / press conference was organized for the role of unorganized sector workers and urban poor. In addition to Shri Amarnath Bhai (Guardian Services Association), Mrs. Seelam Jha (Manager Sarva Seva Sangh) Mr. Anand Prakash Tiwari (Samajwadi Buddha Parishad Varanasi) Mr. Sanjay Roy (Director Aim Trust), besides the coverage of the program and the companions of the media People from all 10 slums were present.

From 15th February to 25th February 2019, meeting with the community in all the 10 slums of the working area, a public declaration was prepared with their participation.



Non Budgeted Activities in the year contributing to achievements

As per the impact of water problem in Khirkiya Ghat and Fort Kohna, repair work of 2 old India Marka handpumps was carried out in Khirkiya Ghat and a new India Marka handpump was commissioned. In this order, water supply started in fort Kohna. In this sequence, the people of the community were benefited from the following work, which was done on the basis of the parody of community and organization workers, which is as follows –

In these three months, weavers' cards were made by the members of the Weavers Development Forum after getting information from project workers.

Contribution of the community/ CBO in the achievements

Community based organization Varanasi Slum Development Committee and Weavers Development Forum, Varanasi based community organization based on the issues of urban poor and weavers, was constructed under the inclusive city project! These organizations are increasing their awareness of their rights and together with the project workers, they are contributing in the following works.

Under this, toilets were taken free of the money spent in the local toilets.

For the first wash and bath in the washroom built by Jayka near Khirkiya Ghat Basti, the people of the settlement used to give 50 rupees per month to the toilets use , but the money which was required to be given in the local toilets was now forgiven by the Slum Development Committee

Challenges faced in implementation and how these challenges have been addressed

- o Disregarding urban poverty problems by government department officials.
- o There is no hearing even after going to the respective departments for the work being done in the interest of the urban poor.
- o The community is not serious about the education of boys right now, due to early morning work and returning in the evening, young children have difficulty in leaving school and bringing it, and there is a problem related to safety of children in sending children to school alone. is.
- o Varanasi is a major pilgrimage place due to large religious festivals and often the arrival of Chief Minister and other big leaders, due to which the Municipal Corporation or other administrative departments, mostly pilgrims, and some It was over the senior leaders who did not have time to meet the municipal corporation or other officials or people's representatives for any problem of the community, wasn't able to find only. Despite this, the people of the community submitted their demand letters to the concerned departments and public representatives offices regarding their problems. Because of the communal tension, the people living on Muslim minority and people are now being deprived of their development. Varanasi works like Saraiya, Kajjakpura, Rahmatpura Maminpura, Bhattha, Muslim Bahluli area and the MLAs here are Hindus, which is BJP They are not being given much attention in the development of this area.

For this, a strategy is being organized by organizing the community and sending them letters to the prime minister in the Prime Minister's Office.

Innovative approach applied in the project

During the survey in the Varanasi Slum area, most of the weavers who have not been given the minimum wages of labor and they do not even have an introductory letter by handloom and entrepreneurship department, and most of the people of this community have education and awareness. There is a huge decrease. Whereas the government, (handloom and ventilation department) provides many types of facilities including registration of weavers, with the exemption of grant / electricity bill, for their employment. But in the absence of awareness, it is unable to register or get its rights. In relation to the above, work is being done for making and Inclusive City 2, Work with weavers under the work of the project is a novelty, which has led to the development of municipal corporation, besides the Department of Labor and handloom and textile department and with their inclusive city project to avail schemes for the weavers community. Work is being done under which the weavers will be lone minus with relaxation in the promotion of employment with rebate of electricity bill. This work is going on.

Case Study 1

Got the Benefit of toilets.....

*Name- Shakutla Devi
Village- Kohima,
District - Varanasi*



My name is Shakuntala Devi, I live in Varanasi, Kohima, with my husband, 3 children, (total 5 people). Due to lack of toilet arrangement in the settlement, the railway line had to go to the shore. About 5 years ago, my third child, who was 11-12 years old, went to the edge of the railway line for defecation, which was hit by the train. He came and died. When the work started here under the inclusive city project, I kept my problem during the meeting. Then, the employees of M trust have given all my documents - Aadhaar, Bank Passbook, a photo online, under the Swachh Bharat Mission, online and then collapsed several times with the relevant Supervisor, which resulted in the first installment of Rs 4000 in my account. After that I started to build toilets. The work has been done till the construction of potholes and sheets in toilets is done. There is still the work to do the door and plaster of the toilet. The work will also be completed when another installment of 8000 rupees will be given, with the help of the organization, a great problem is solved.

Case Study 2

Benefits of Gas found under Prime Minister Ujjwala Gas Scheme in association with the organization

Kusum Devi wife of Raju Sahni lives for the past 20 years in the slum colony with her family in the age of 32 years, the widow ghat, near-Malviya bridge, Rajghat, Varanasi. Two children Shivam Sahni are 11 years old and 7 years old, both of these children read at Mother Teresa Convent School. Since the inclusive city project began work, it has been joined since the last meeting that kept this problem in the last meeting that there was a problem of fire burning during the cooking of the children early in the morning and the food could not be cooked!

After that the form was filled up under the prime minister's Ujjwala gas scheme and the documents were collected, which they did not have, and then they were deposited in the Bhadau Chungi Rajghat gas agency, all their related documents were submitted in the photograph, ration card, photo copy of bank passbook. After this, after almost a foul-up, they got the benefit of gas under Prime Minister Ujjwala Gas Scheme within about a month. Kusum Devi says that I wanted to buy food for cooking like dry wood / kanda etc. which used to cost up to Rs.1000 per month and we did not have enough room to keep it safe from rain, if the wood in the rain Or the beetle gets soaked in the cooking habits! I have got the benefit of this gas for free now and if I had to make gas afterwards, it would not be as expensive as it was for buying a fire.

Case Study 3

Benefits of card and health made under Ayushman India.....

Name- Randheer Kumar s/o Jumman

Address- Bhattha, Varanasi

Distric- Varanasi (UP)



Randhir Kumar son Jumman, living with his family in slum, Varanasi. They work of weavers, he has been suffering from Hernia disease for the past two years, due to lack of money, they were unable to treat their Harnia disease,

When the work of the inclusive city project started, they associated with the organization and kept coming in community meetings and taking insights. Similarly, when he got information about Ayushman Bharat Scheme in the community meeting of the organization, he said that my card was also made and I used to get treatment for my Harnia disease, then all the documents that were collected by the institution in this scheme were collected. For example - the entire family card, ration card, and voter card etc., then with the workers of the organization, this health department has more Within a period of about 15 days the documents were collected by the people and their age became the card of the Bharat Scheme. After which he started treating his doctor, asked the doctor to do the operation and he was operated! Randhir Kumar is healthy. The medicine is going on now Mr. Saroj Pathak, who came to know his house, said that Randhir Kumar is very happy that due to the association of the organization, his old disease has been cured. He thanked the workers of M / IGSSS and inclusive city project.

Digital Empowerment



AIM Works for Women in Villages for digital Empowerment

In 2015, only 1 out of every 10 Internet user in rural India was a woman. Tata Trusts and Google came together to address this huge gender gap and introduced a digital literacy program, based on ‘train the trainer’ model. Women from villages are trained on using the Internet and are made equipped with data-enabled devices. These women are known as Internet Saathis and work as trainers, to help other women in their village to get started on their Internet journey and benefit from it. As of January 2017, there are more than 36,000 Internet Saathis who have helped over 13.5 million women learn about the Internet across 130,000 villages. As part of the program,



rural women are trained with the basic skills of device use, and are introduced to the medium of internet. The idea is to initially make them comfortable with the use of technology. Aiding in the process of digital literacy, Google and its partners in the project begin with spreading awareness about the internet, and its potential benefits.

After basic skills are taught, the program identifies potential 'Internet Saathis' or trainers who go forth and train more women in the given region.

The women are provided with a budget tablet, a smartphone, and data connection to teach the basics of device functioning and internet use. These Internet Saathis, once fully trained, are then assigned various projects where they can travel to the next village and train more women

AIM Works for Women in Rural/Villages for Livelihood

Aim works for Livelihood of the Saathis in the District of Lakhim Pur Kheri. The projects aims to socio economic development of the women in villages. They first become cynosure of the village later they get name and fame by working with working for the organization. Phia expands Internet Saathi Program to Create Sustainable Livelihood Opportunities for Women in Rural

India. Under this initiative, Aim is working with Phia, to create digitally enabled livelihood opportunities for the Internet Saathis. FRIEND, has become the new foundation a vehicle for other like minded companies and institutions to utilize the Internet Saathi network and enable dissemination of information and services in the rural areas thereby creating newer avenues of income for these women in rural India. This will be in addition to imparting digital literacy to millions of rural women under the ongoing Internet Saathi program.

Empowerment of the Women in villages-

Aim engaging with Saathis achieved the target in the villages of Lakhim pur Kheri district. Sathi's who have entertained the Internet sathi Programme and needed socio economic development to break social barriers for their rights and lost confidence. They have been the



victim of the patriarchal society. They are deprived from everywhere and made home slaves. They were not letting to know the world. Their desires have been controlled by the inhuman societal barriers in the villages. But

they are now connected with the world and can have the knowledge of constitutional rights human rights. After this project they got to know the world and inculcating the skills they needed to make a new era. They are getting all the information regarding their need from needle to elephant. They are learning through social sites, you tube, bolo app and gathering all the information related to their livelihood.

Skill development

Each Saathi is working in the villages of Kheri district like helping others to help themselves. They are teaching regarding the internet safety and security as to not let their moral down. They are learning how to teach some of the saathi have started giving tuition to the students and are

earning from it. They go on you tube and learn the pedagogy and enhancing their knowledge .

They don't have think for money for the book. They get abundant materials for their need. They are learning how to fill the forms some of them have started their own cybercafé in the village for the form filling and other internet facilities. Now they talk



about their rights. Some are working as beautician and stitching. They charge for the service and also training others to make more opportunities. They are becoming socially and economically strong.

Empowering in Agriculture

As we all know that a country can't be developed without the participation of the women. Aim Trust gave all possible supports to those women who were not able to break social barriers and also wasn't able to give their family a economical support as most of the women in the villages are illiterate and unskilled. They have been deprived from education and modernism due to economic problems.

Earlier women had less participation in Agriculture but now they have the knowledge of different varieties of the seeds, diseases of plants, fertilizers. Now women have knowledge of every way, about farming. She now knows what kind of medicine need, which kind of insecticide, which fertilizer where and how much it feels. They now know about Vermicompost. They also know the amount of water to be given to the crop. When should soil check, They have come to know through YouTube about how to plant trees from, about different types of modern agricultural machinery. They have the knowledge of seasonal vegetables and grains to be grown.

Breaking social barriers.....

Ragini Verma

My name is Ragini Verma and my father name is Sri Rakesh Verma . I am 27 year old. I live with my family, in Kaima village of Mitauli block Lakhim pur Kheri,. I graduated in B.A. My husband name is Sri Gyanesh Verma and father –in-law is Raja Ram Verma. My husband and brother in law both are working in field for the livelihood as both have graduated but are still unemployed. My father in law is also working for the same. So my whole family depends on agriculture only. There is no outside income in my family. I was only home maker though I graduated.

I did my schooling from government school and later I did my graduation from Ganna Kisan Mahavidyalaya. My father is too poor to run the family as he is a private teacher and getting only 2000 per month which wasn't sufficient to run my family. Though I graduated I had no smart phone or internet access. While my graduation I learn stitching to help my father but I wasn't not skilled, So I tried to manage for my own study. I got married after my 2nd year of B.A. and I completed my graduation from my new home. I had access to only keypad phone but no smart cell phone. I was very shy nature girl before I joined this programme. Every one used to say that I won't be able to do anything in my life except being home maker. When I saw my husband and my brother in law both are in the same boat. My moral got very down. But when I joined Aim Trust as Internet saathi with support of Phia. I got first step to my goal and my pride. I was trained for getting online. First when I used the smart phone I thought why was I deprived but when I got this opportunity I started with the same. First of all showed my courage to interact with people after convincing my family they allowed when I made them understand. When I was

trained then I found myself different from others. I started giving training for the same. Hence I improved my communication skills and explaining capability. Then people started contacting me to get training on internet and new about internet. I get respect everywhere. I have found my lost confidence. Along with the training I stated learning parlor work which is my dream. I learnt facial beauty, hair design and pattern, Mehandi. Now people call me for taking training. I have made many groups for internet saathi . I have encouraged 85 women out of this 50 are connected to bolo app and they are continuously using and learning. Some of them giving training to others.

This is possible due to Internet and support and a step towards empowerment else nobody takes care for such things.

Now I have the knowledge of agriculture- farming , seeds, insecticides, fertilizers, soils types and regular checkup , irrigation , technical farming , types of machines , seasonal vegetables and .

I know about mineral and nutrients for balance diets and about diseases and their prevention. she told about vitamin D when it was asked she told the resource and effect in efficiency. This project has made her regain the lost confidence. Now I have good credit in my village and other villages. “Mujhe Meri Pehchan Mili hai” Now I want to run a parlor along with stitching further more and want to be connected to this project.

I Suman Verma, lives in Kaima village. My childhood was not good as I belong to a poor family. My father have very less land and my whole family depends on this. My father is a farmer. I had to face financial crises many time during my schooling and college time. My father was very worried for my marriage. I completed my graduation (B.A.). I got married after my graduation. I was to be a house wife. I supposed to not go outside of the home. I supposed to cook the food and look after the children only. But I wanted to do something in my life as my many friends are doing job. I did not know I have such talent or I would do something in my life but home keeping. I was living a simple life and had no recognition to the society. I was very bad in healthy communication. Since I joined Aim trust, have curved my life and given a new amplitude to my life. I got online with the help of Aim trust and Phia as I was selected as internet saathi. At first my family wasn't satisfied by my this effort. But when I got training from google team and Aim trust and Phia team. I was felt high. It seemed to me that I have touched the sky I like something different of others in the village and now I can add a new feather in my cap. I started giving training to women of my village and in other villages to make them get online. Gradually my communication skill was enhanced earlier I used to face fumble for words or hesitation but now I am good at explaining. I have thrown out my residual fear. I gave training to the women of villages and they are now using smart phone and now they can get all the information on one click. I found this that I can communication have become strong. I have regained my lost confidence. I started using Bolo app and youtube. I am using many Social sites apps and google search engine to search all the information required. I have learnt how to be beautician and how to increase facial beauty. I have learnt how make hair design. I have the knowledge of all the cosmetics required in parlor with price of the product, variety of companies and many more. I have also learnt how to order material online and how to use waste materials in making of crafts, hand fan, how to make chips and other products. With the help of internet I have curved myself in the area of stitching and parlor. I have opened my own parlor in the village and take booking in parties and marriage for parlor and stitching. I have started proving

training for beautician and stitching to others of the villages and charge 300. Over all my income is 14000 to 16000 a month and in the Sahalak time it increases 25000.

Now I have my own respect in the village. I am thankful to Aim trust and Phia who are making us to live with respect and pride and empowering us. I want to be connected in future and would like to give training to others as well. This is my “Pehchaan”.

My name is Deepa Raj and I live in Nimchaini in Mitauli block. I am 20 years old and I am in B.Com 1st year. I joined this project as internet saathi with the help of Aim Trust and Phia. My family was too poor to run my family. Somehow they manage by doing labour work and working in field. Though we have some land due to lack of awareness they were not able to do modern farming. They were based on only traditional farming which gave less production. I had to quit once my schooling because my father was not able to pay the expenses. Later on I

continued by doing labour work. It is very difficult to do labour work too due to patriarchal society. You will have listen “Taane Baane” of the people. I want to be C.A. but for it I need money which I don’t have but since I have joined the internet saathi programme I don’t have to go for labour work. I took training for internet access and how to use internet. I started connecting with women of the villages because most of the women in villages are not allowed to have their own cell phone or smart phone. I started spreading awareness and training to the village women. I had enhanced my communication skills and I don’t get down while talking to them. I have got my recognition and dignity but I still want to be connected so that I can be a part of change makers so that I can make my dream come true. Through internet I have learnt lots of things which is helping me to earn money as well. When I motivate women in my villages and others I get motivated. And before telling them I first learn a lot and do in practical which is generating money to which makes me productive. I have learnt how to make hand bags , hand fan, different patterns and designs, crafts making has become possible due to youtube. I have starting making crafts and other things using local materials and waste material and my house is decorated by it. 30 women are using Bolo app and they are learning and teaching their children as well. Over all I have become the centre of attraction in my village and other villages where nobody knew me. I am so thankful to Aim trust who has given me this opportunity (after successfully completion of my internet saathi programme and bolo app installation and training) to teach in his CAC. I would like to give my best and also want to be connected. This would not have been possible without the help of Aim trust and Phia.

Climate Change & Resilient Agriculture



Climate change is one of the pressing issues of the Indian sub-continent, and the Indian agriculture faces the harshest impact of it. Most of the agriculture in India is still largely rainfed and the farmers are small & marginal practicing subsistence farming, especially vulnerable to changes in climate and rainfall. Most of the farmers practice subsistence farming or marginal land-holdings. With the allure of better livelihood options outside the state (primarily in defence and hospitality services), there has also been large scale outmigration from these villages of mainly the male youth, and even male adults, closely followed by their entire families. Agriculture in these areas are now largely taken care of by the women folk left behind while the men leave looking for better income options. These women take care of the household domestic chores as well as most of the farming activities (other than ploughing, which is still mainly done by the men), although their food produce/ income from these fields remain very small.

Aim trust works with support of Oxfam India with Farmers in Lakhimpur District as to connect them with agriculture for the economic development of the women and men as they are migrating leaving farming where agriculture have been good scope for their livelihood. Due to lack of awareness less literacy rate and they don't know their potential and technical farming.

Aim trust aims to connect them with it and make them productive as we all know that farmers are the backbone of the country.

One day workshop was organised on 14th September, 2018 in Gram Panchayat Pakariya Jalalpur. In the workshop, participated 45 women farmers were given information about animal husbandry and livestock management and care as well as information about various animals. : Vertinery Dr. Sharing Livestock Management and Care Practices with Women Farmers



Two day Training of Trainers on Climate Resilient Agriculture System

In JaivikBhawan, 25 women farmers had participated in the Training of Trainers programme held on 21st September, 2018. The programme was started with discussion about the Integrated Pest Management. The farmers were apprised about the linkages of IPM with the climate resilience. The difference between friend and enemy insects was also shared. The mechanical and biological approaches of the Integrated Pest Management were discussed in with farmers in detailed, and they were apprised about their operational process. The consequences of use of chemicals were also discussed and farmers were motivated to adopt the organic manure and

biocides. The farmers were also educated to produce all types of organic manures and biocides at their home from their own available resources. Dr. Manoj Kumar, Scientist is Sharing IPM Practices with Women Farmers.

Education Tour of Women Farmers 15-16 October, 2018

Under two day educational tour programme, 36 women farmers had participated in KrishiMela, organised at Chandra Shekhar Agriculture and Technical University, Kanpur on 15 and 16 October, 2018. The women farmers had obtained information about various crops like wheat, tomato, chilli, vegetables, pulses and edible oil crops. In the krishi mela they have also provided the information regarding the agricultural equipments, bio pesticides, vegetable growing process with high breed seed which are the useful for the local women farmers. Farmers had also learnt their cultivation methods (How to use power tiller, power weeder and zero tiller, how to use solar pump and get benefit from Govt. at subsidized rate), for gaining their optimum production in various conditions. Agriculture department, horticulture, sericulture, high yielding seeds, agricultural equipment, herbal garden, medicinal and aromatic plant department. Some of the exhibition were very usefull and the women farmers were learnt and replicate in their area.



Submission of Demand Letter to Chief Minister and Agriculture Director by the Women Farmers

Traditional pro-environmental and sustainable agriculture has been transformed into anti environment and un-sustainable agriculture by the Green revolution. Consequently, mainly the small farmers have suffered badly. The higher amount of chemical fertiliser and water demanding crops and dependency on market have resulted in reduced or stagnant agricultural income followed by water crisis. Also, the economic globalization policy has ignored agriculture sector badly, consequently, agriculture sector has



turned into a loss making occupation. Due to lack of alternate income option at local place, the farmers are compelled either to migrate out their village or continue their traditional income occupation. In this backdrop, being aggrieved from the discriminatory implementation of government schemes, a group of women farmers had met the Director- Agriculture Directorate at Lucknow and submitted their demand letter.

ToT of 50 farmers on mulching, mixed cropping, water efficient irrigation processes, kitchen garden, SRI and SWI

A two days ToT was organized for women farmers with an objective to trained women farmers on different climate resilient practices and to develop the understanding of doing CRA practices by using locally available low cost. The training was held at ParijatHall,Lucknow. the trainer provide information to women farmers about soil testing, land treatment, seed treatment, seed sowing by line methods with usage and benefits. Dr. Gaya Tiwari was the resource person. He told farmers that spring color and drip is provided by government on 90% subsidy to farmer and the farmers who do cultivation of garlics, tomato, chilly, gourd, ridge gourd, bitter gourd, cauliflower etc get seeds of these vegetables on 100% subsidy under Direct Benefit Transfer scheme. He also informed farmers that spray machine, tractor 20 HP, power triller (8 HP) are also provided by Horticulture department on 50% subsidy. On second day, there was discussion on benefits of usage of organic pesticides like Jeevamrit ghol, Jaivik keetnashak, Beauveria Basiana, use of trycoderma and its benefits. They also discuss on usage and benefits of mulching, SRI, SWI, mixed cropping and kitchen garden renowned agriculture scientist Dr. G. Tiwari facilitated the group discussion during the training.

वाराणसी। मंगलवार को सर्व सेवा संघ परिसर राजघाट वाराणसी में एम ट्रस्ट तथा वाराणसी स्लम विकास समिति द्वारा आयोजित मजदूरों के मुद्दों पर कामगार संसद का आयोजन किया गया। जिसमें वाराणसी को स्मार्ट सिटी बनाने में शहरी गरीबों की भूमिका के विषय पर गोष्ठे को यह विदित हो कि वाराणसी में 227 मिलन बस्तों हैं जिसके अंतर्गत शहरी क्षेत्र में 50 प्रतिशत ऐसे लोग हैं जो असंगठित मजदूर के रूप में कार्य करते हैं जैसे निर्माण मजदूर, बोझा ढोने वाले लोग, ठेका चलाने वाले मजदूर, दाह संस्कार करने वाले मजदूर, झाड़ू पोछा का काम करने वाले कामगार तथा कुटी बोनने वाले लोग हैं। ऐसे मजदूरों/शहरी बेरोजगारों को शहरी बेरोजगारों के जीवन और आजीविका के अधिकार कि रक्षा होनी चाहिए। बेरोजगारों को पत्रचान और सभी कल्याणकारी योजनाओं तक पहुंच प्रदान किया जाना चाहिए। मुख्य तथा असंगठित कामगार अधिकार मंच के डॉ. मोहम्मद आरिफ ने कहा की असंगठित कामगार मजदूरों को उनकी पहचान दिलाना और उनके अधिकारों के प्रति उन्हें जागरूक करना हमारा मुख्य उद्देश्य है। उन्होंने आगे बताया कि मजदूरों के साथ होने वाले दुर्भाव को रोकने के लिए मजदूरों को संबोधित हो और उनको मानक के अनुसूचित मूल्य मिल सके उनके परिवारों को स्वास्थ्य लाभ मिल सके साथ ही बहर से आये श्रमिकों को शहर में कम मूल्य पर भोजन मिल सके। इसके लिये सरकार से मांग करने की जरूरत है। ऐसी महिला जो दूसरों के घरों में काम करती है उन्हें सामाजिक सुरक्षा का लाभ मिले उनको उचित पारिश्रमिक मिले जिससे कामगार महिला अपने परिवार का पालन पोषण कर सके। बच्चों को उचित शिक्षा मिले साथ ही अर्थात् समूह का लाभ असंगठित कामगारों के बच्चों को मिले उनको आवास की सुविधा मिले और कामगार महिलाओं के कर्ष के समय का निर्धारण हो तथा उनको मजदूरी निर्धारित हो। कार्यक्रम को अध्यक्षता कर रहे गोपीवती विचारधारा के संवाहक अमरनाथ भाई ने कहा शहरी बेरोजगारों और अभावग्रस्त जीवन शैली वाले लोगों को अभी भी अपराह्न है। गोष्ठे में एम ट्रस्ट के निदेशक संजय राय, सबका समान अधिकार होगा। चाँदिए। प्रोफेसर डाक्टर संजय अय्यक समान संकाय, राजघाट वाराणसी के जलालपुरा के पार्षद शब्दी ओकास अंसारी के अलावा शहरी गरीबों के मुद्दों पर काम करने वाले अन्य संस्था व युनिवर्स के लोग उपस्थित रहे। गोष्ठे में समुदाय से गोपल साहनी, राजू शाहनी, शशीकान्त, इकबाल आदि ने भी अपनी समस्याओं को रखा।
