# Gender Justice & Empowerment



Gender justice and empowerment are fundamental to fostering inclusive and sustainable development, as they address systemic inequalities that hinder social and economic progress. By empowering women and girls, societies unlock their full potential, leading to healthier communities, stronger economies, and more equitable governance.

## A. Hello Bitiya Manch- A Platform for Adolescent Empowerment

Hello Bitiya Manch is a vibrant collective of adolescent girls established in Lakhimpur District as part of the Adolescent Girls Program. This collective serves as a safe and empowering space where girls come together to learn, share, and build their capacities to challenge societal barriers and take charge of their futures.

The program guides girls through a five-phase journey from welcoming them as daughters to cultivating fearlessness, empowering them with education and confidence, preparing them for responsibility, and ultimately ensuring they become financially independent.

We initiate various programs such as Digital Literacy Training, Kitchen Garden, Sports Activities, and Self Defense to achieve our goals.

- Empowered **25,000+** adolescent girls in life skills, leadership & self-defense
- Enabled **5,000+** girls to stay in school through after- school support
- Formed **200** adolescent groups promoting leadership and rights
- Health and hygiene kits distributed to girls

## B. Adolescent Girls Empowerment Program

Aim Trust's Empowering Adolescent Girls Program addresses the educational, socio-cultural, and health challenges faced by adolescent girls. The program focuses on providing information, skills, and support to improve girls' education, safety, and overall well-being.

The program follows a comprehensive, multi-layered approach involving several stages of intervention:

- Awareness & education
- Skill development & empowerment
- Community mobilization
- Institutional support
- Policy advocacy

- Over **500** girls gained awareness about their rights and access to services
- **1500+** women received training in financial literacy and entrepreneurship & **200+** girls received vocational training
- **300** families committed to supporting their daughters' education, and 20 villages participated in mobilization efforts against early marriage



The girl students are provided with structured career counselling through interactive workshops and one-on-one guidance

# Sports for Girls

Under the Hello Bitiya Initiative, a major focus has been laid on sports. Sports has been used as an enabler in building confidence, promoting leadership, improving physical and mental health, and challenging gender stereotypes.

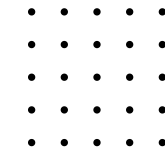


At Aim Trust, we aim to expand the sports program to reach more girls and to provide them with quality training facilities along with exposure to district and state-level competition



Through our regular sports events & team participation, we have witnessed a significant improvement in the girl's confidence, leadership abilities and community engagement. We also have cricket teams in various villages that showcase talent and inspire others to join

# Integrated Child Development



Our approach to integrated child development is centered on improving children's lives through holistic interventions that enhance health and nutrition while providing access to a modern digital learning space. This comprehensive model ensures children are physically well and equipped with the skills needed for a digitally connected future.

## A. Improving Lives of Children



Under its “Lucknow Urban Development Project”, the Aim Trust covered more than 1500 households, and worked intensively to address challenges in each locality, ensuring tailored support to meet the needs of the residents.

The intervention focused on:

- Infrastructure development in schools
- Community and life skills program
- Developing digital learning centres

## B. Health and Nutrition

The project “Healthy Children, Nourished Futures” focusses on enhancing early childhood education, hygiene, and nutrition in under-served villages in Uttar Pradesh.

The initiative operates pre-school and nutrition centers and has the following 5 components:

- Learning materials
- Nutrition
- Hygiene boost
- Resource distribution
- Mother’s forum

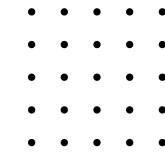


- Provided holistic development to **5,639** children
- Provided furniture and resolved water-logging in damaged floors
- **350** children gained digital skills and received certificates from NIIT
- **68** children received training on Python programming, **23** received Internet Security & Safety training
- 110 adolescent girls received STEM education

- **3000+** girls reached through **30+** menstrual hygiene sessions
- **500+** malnourished children provided with supplementary nutrition
- **1200+** children received health check-ups
- New filtration systems installed in **8** villages for safe drinking water



# Sustainable Livelihood



We aim to address the gender-related challenges faced by small and marginal women farmers and workers in the sugar value chain in Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, and Maharashtra by improving women's access to welfare schemes, education, healthcare, and sustainable agricultural practices, thereby ensuring inclusive development

## Sugar Value Chain- Women Welfare

Aim Trust has worked extensively to engage with communities through regular village meetings, identifying challenges faced by women and facilitating connections to government welfare schemes.

The program has successfully enrolled drop-out children of cane cutters in schools and provided necessary educational support. Simultaneously, health and hygiene workshops were conducted to address prevalent community health issues, developing a culture of better hygiene practices and disease prevention.

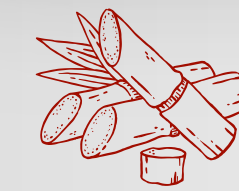
The organization has also raised awareness about digital platforms such as E-Ganna and E-Shram to enhance transparency and access to entitlements.

To promote skill development and sustainability, women have been trained in leadership, financial literacy, and sustainable farming methods through Good Agriculture Practices (GAP).

The formation of self-help groups has further encouraged entrepreneurship and economic independence among women, enabling them to take greater control of their lives.



- Strengthened **500+** SHGs
- Trained **5,000+** women in financial literacy and entrepreneurship
- Linked **2,00,000** families of sugarcane cutters to welfare schemes
- Production unit established for organic jaggery, increasing household income by **30%**
- Supported **500+** women access loans
- Trained **1,200+** women in stitching, poultry, and food processing
- Honored by the Hon. Governor with the Vinoba Seva Samman for advancing the rights of sugarcane cutters and farmers



AIM Trust collaborated with agricultural experts and scientists to train farmers on these multiple cropping practices



# NutriTreasure:

## Women's Economic Empowerment Through Value-Added Nutrition Products

The initiative enhances women's livelihoods by building skills in transforming traditional food ingredients into high-value nutrition products. Women are trained in improved food processing, product diversification, and market engagement to increase income opportunities.

### Nutrient-Enriched Jaggery Products:

The initiative focuses on blending jaggery with various plants to significantly boost its nutritional value

### Shree Shakti Van:

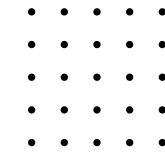
A mobile van, named "Shree Shakti Van" was launched to serve as a sales and distribution channel to local markets

### Marketplace for Women:

Women sell nutrient-rich jaggery products, such as laddoos and sweets, directly in local markets, creating an income source for them



# Climate Change & Environmental Protection



With climate change escalating natural disasters, jeopardizing food security, and driving mass displacement, immediate action is imperative to prevent future challenges from becoming insurmountable.

## Climate Resilient Agriculture Program

Aim Trust implemented several initiatives to address climate change and promote environmental protection. The organization introduced sustainable agricultural techniques and encouraged organic farming practices among local farmers to reduce the use of harmful chemicals.

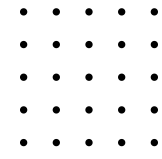
Agricultural waste management was also a key focus, with the Trust promoting composting and recycling methods to minimize environmental impact.

To improve air quality, Aim Trust monitored oxygen levels in the community and launched plantation drives to increase green cover in the region. These efforts were aimed at creating a more sustainable and eco-friendlier environment.

- Over **3,500** women across 25 villages trained in sustainable agricultural practices
- Successfully converted a significant number of farmers to **organic farming**, leading to healthier crops and reduced chemical use
- Conducted **large-scale plantation drives**, resulting in the planting of thousands of trees and a noticeable improvement in local air quality
- Support during disasters, including Covid-19 vaccination drives and flood relief



# Inclusion



We believe that inclusion is power! Our initiatives are designed to dismantle barriers, creating a society where the unique abilities and perspectives of disabled people are not only accommodated but also recognized as a driving force for innovation and collective progress.

## Skills, Employment, and Empowerment

Beginning as a tribute to Helen Keller, Aim Trust organized an event in collaboration with the National Association for the Blind, India Business Disability Network and Confederation of Indian Industry, focused on the importance of inclusive skilling and training, highlighting the urgency of accessible skilling frameworks, government-industry partnerships, and career progression pathways for persons with disabilities. Emphasis was laid on inclusive hiring strategies, awareness within leadership, and building universally accessible ecosystems in the private sector.

The platform enabled pathways to address key issues for the blind people:

- Inclusion as action
- Skilling with accessibility
- Lived experiences matter
- Cultural strength
- Community-led solutions

## AuDis Band (Au = Audio, Dis = Disability)

AuDis band is a global initiative showcasing artists who may be visually impaired, physically challenged, or from dwarf communities.

Through music, song, dance, and drama, they prove that ability is limitless. Their performances break barriers and inspire society to reimagine inclusion. AuDis Band has been invited to perform at Tahbib 2025, Dubai (27th–29th November 2025), a prestigious cultural festival held annually on Dubai National Day. This year's festival will be graced by the legendary writer and poet Shri Javed Akhtar as the chief guest, making it a landmark opportunity for AuDis to represent India's inclusivity before the world.

AuDis Band will represent India with 8–10 artists, along with their manager and curators. Their art is proof that vision is not limited to sight—it is born from passion and soul.

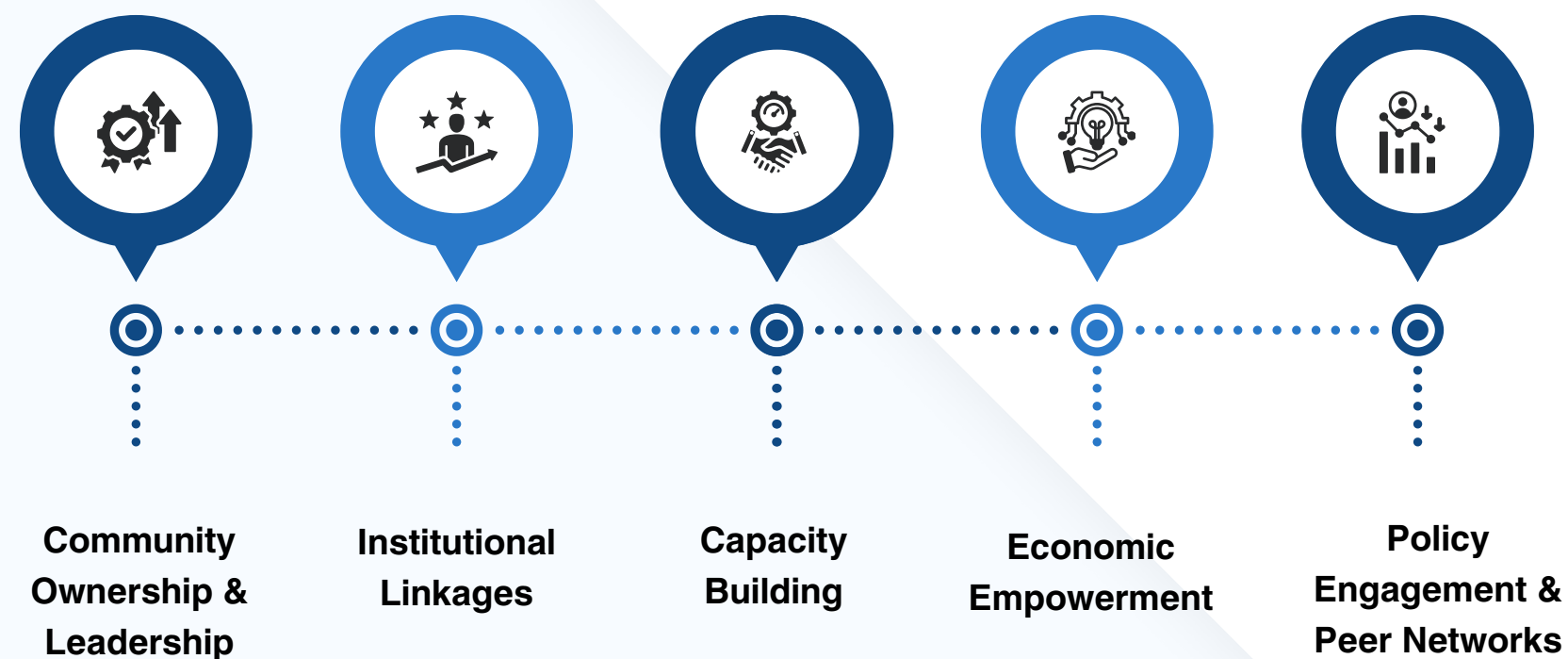

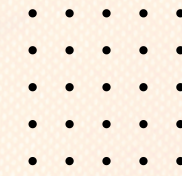


# Sustainability Plan

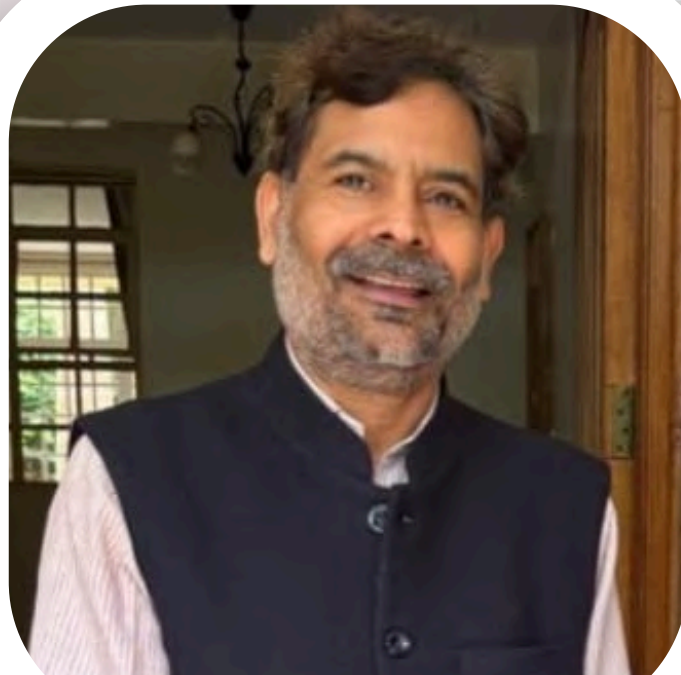

# Preeti Upadhyaya

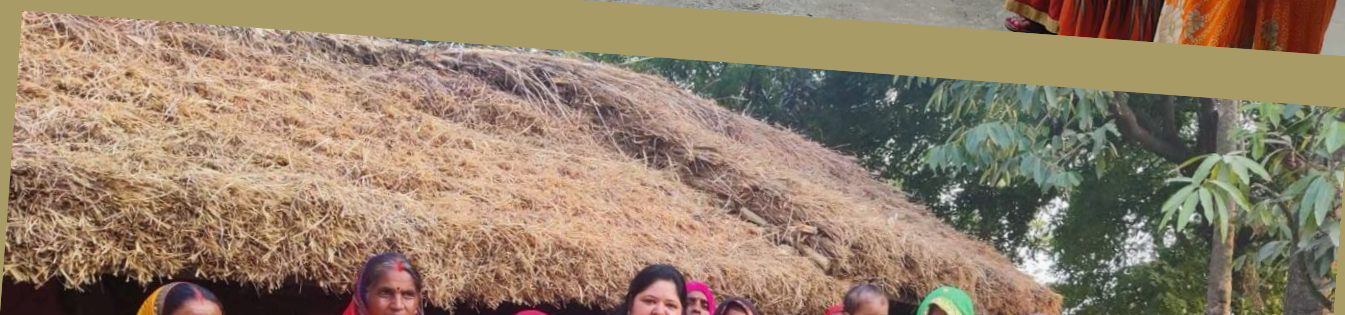
- Preeti Upadhyaya is a purpose-driven changemaker with over two decades of cross-sector experience in research, social innovation, and leadership development.
